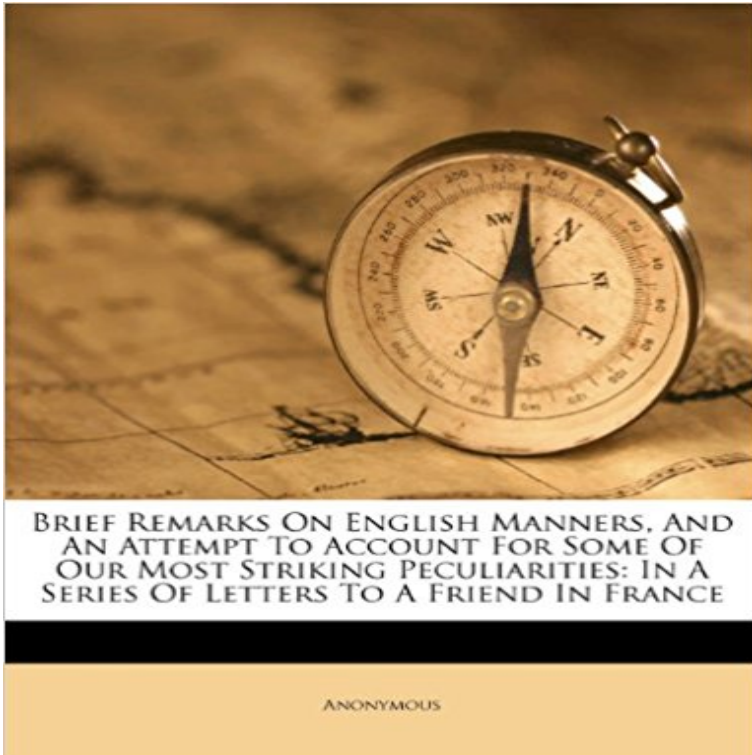


Brief Remarks On English Manners, And An Attempt To Account For Some Of Our Most Striking Peculiarities: In A Series Of Letters To A Friend In France
