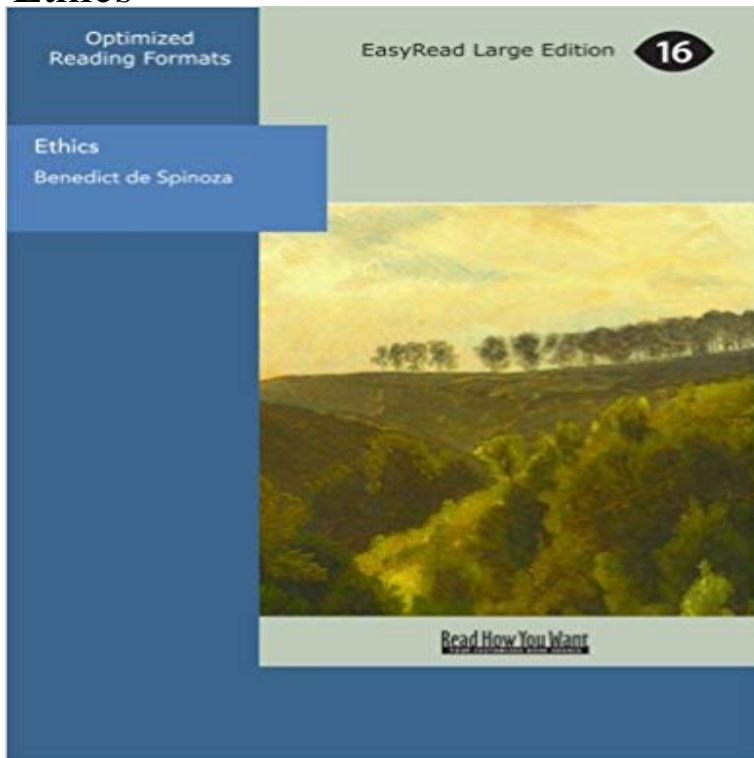


# Ethics
