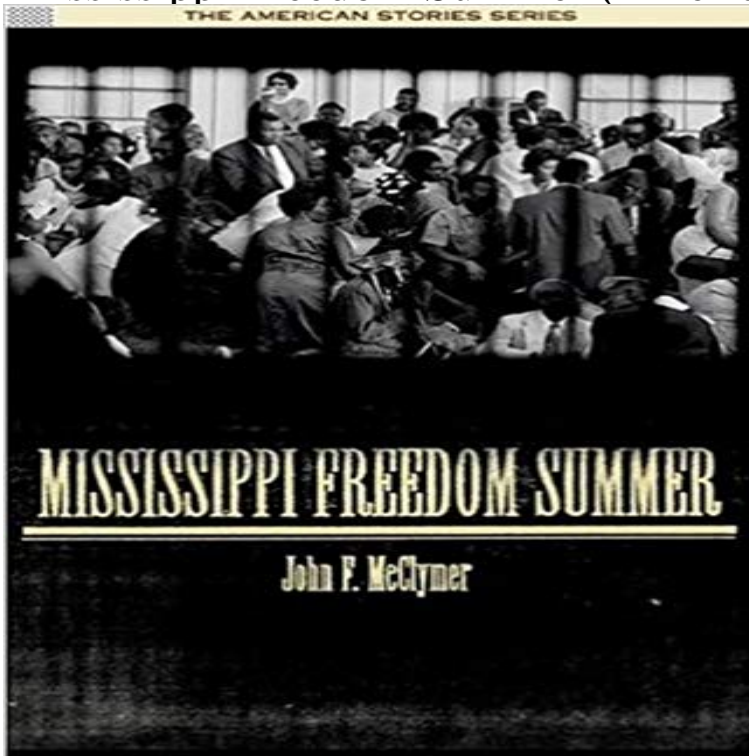


Mississippi Freedom Summer (American Stories)
