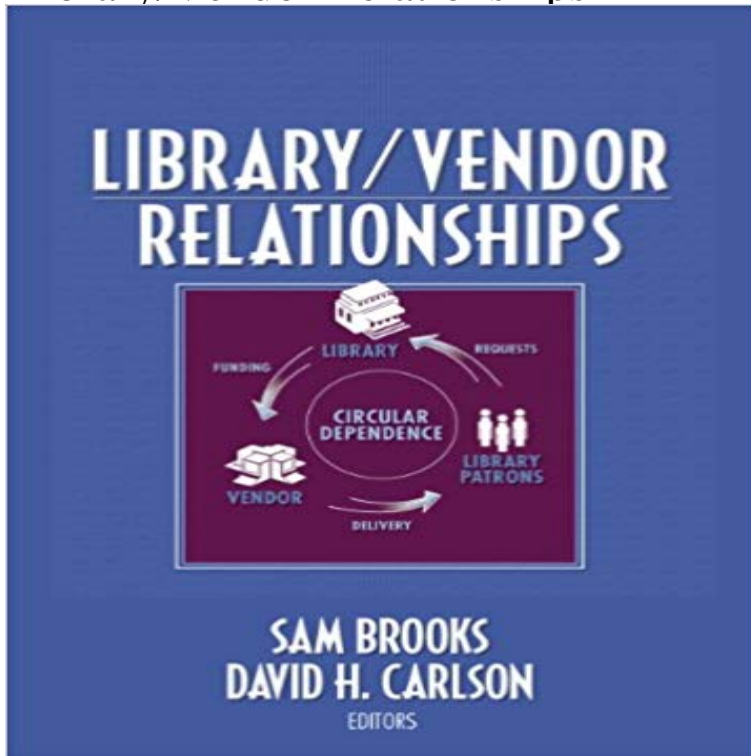


Library/Vendor Relationships
