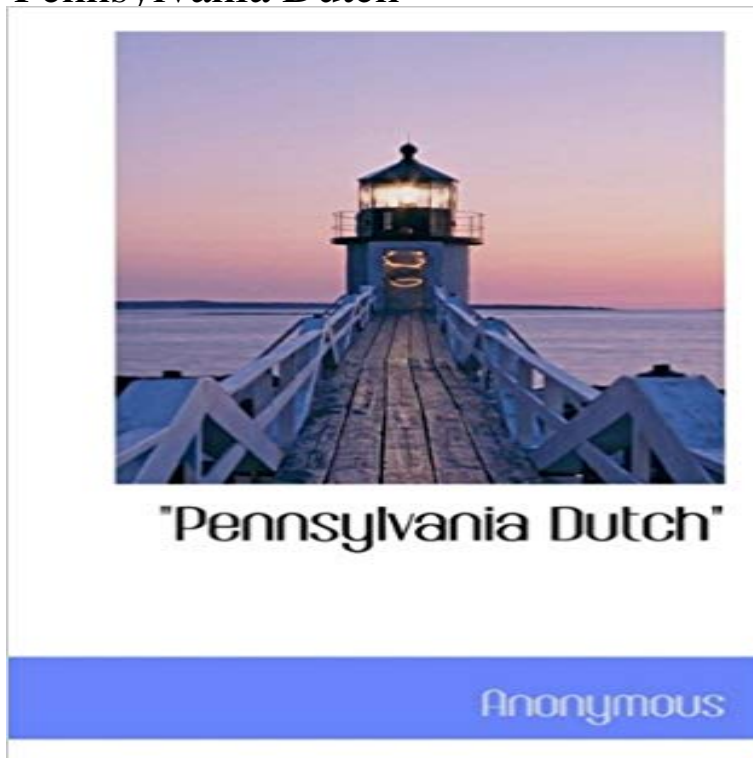


## Pennsylvania Dutch
