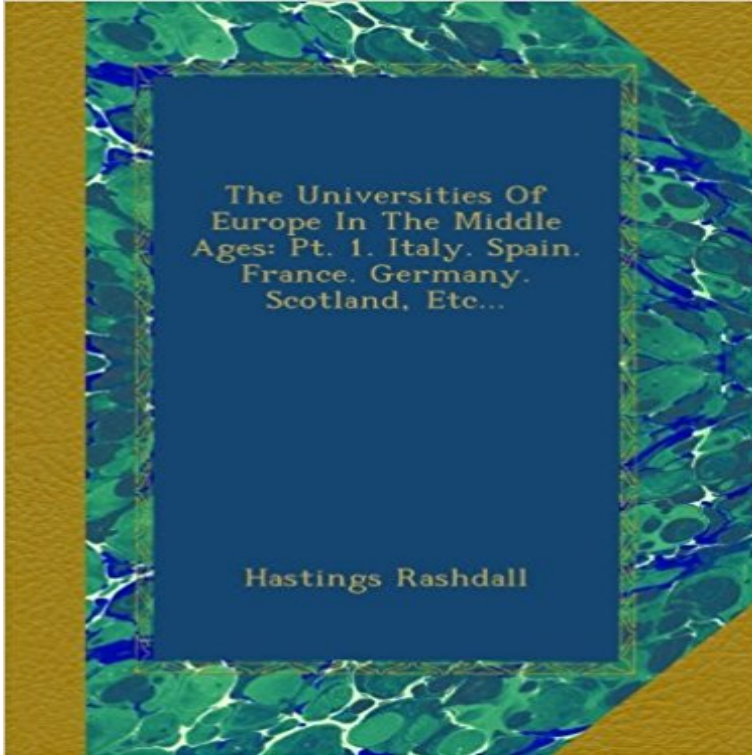


# The Universities Of Europe In The Middle Ages: Pt. 1. Italy. Spain. France. Germany. Scotland, Etc...
