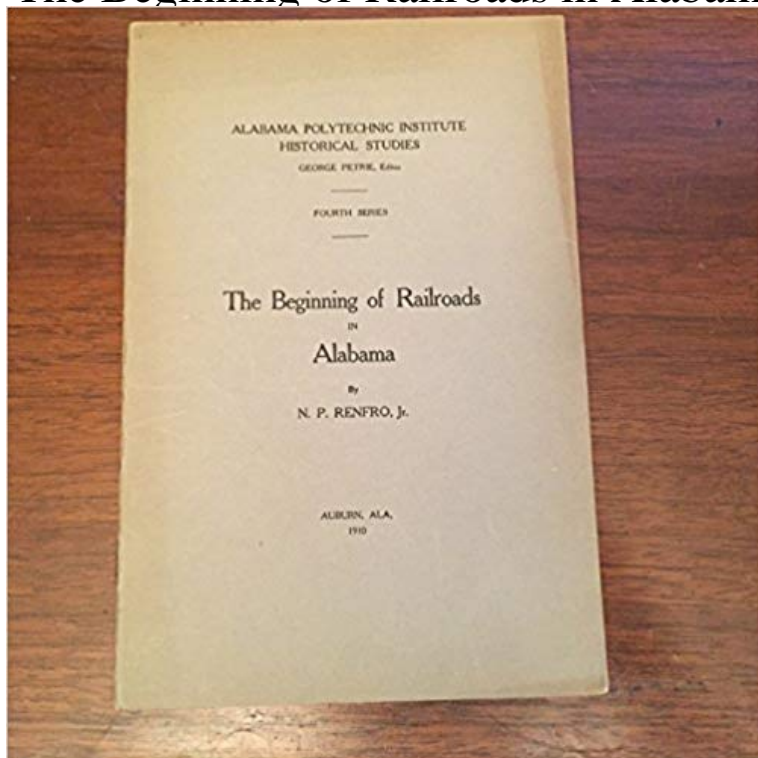


The Beginning of Railroads in Alabama (Historical Studies)
