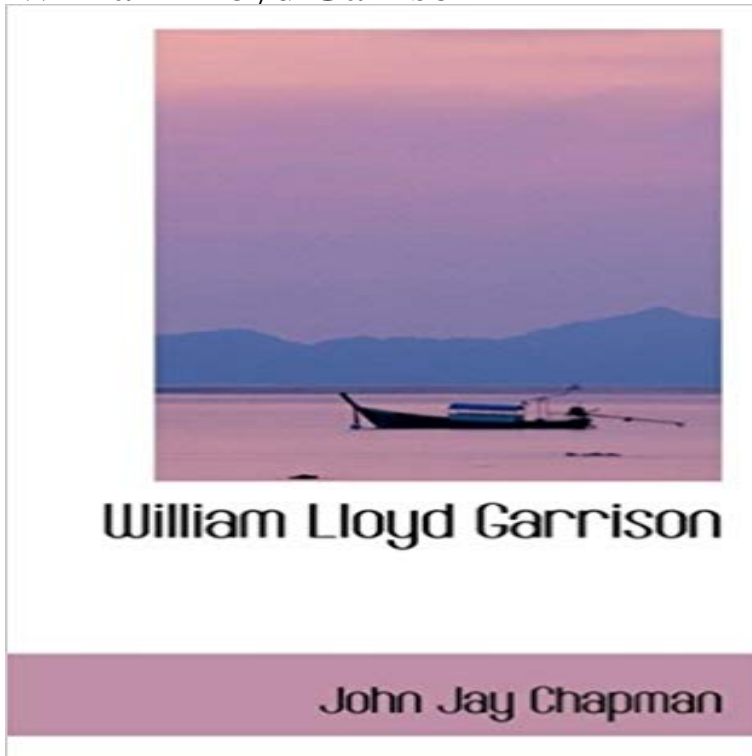


## William Lloyd Garrison
